

Two Person Golf Scramble
Information Sheet
Spring 2008

This information sheet is intended to provide basic information and rules for this activity. Please refer to the “Policies” link on the home page of the intramural web page for detailed information about policies and procedures of the Intramural Activities Program.

ENTRIES OPEN:

May 6-15, 2008 (**Entries are limited and are sold on a first come, first served basis.**)

ENTRY FEE:

A \$30.00 non-refundable entry fee will be required at registration for each team. The entry fee will cover green fees, carts, awards, and course reservation.

DAYS, TIME, AND LOCATION OF PLAY:

Thursday, May 22nd with tee times from 4:00 – 6:00 p.m. at Sleepy Ridge Golf Course (700 S. Sleepy Ridge Dr., Orem, UT). You will need to sign up for a tee time when you register for the tournament. **Please arrive at the golf course at least twenty minutes before your scheduled tee time.**

ELIGIBILITY:

Spring 2008 full-time students (6 credits), and faculty/staff are eligible. Part-time students, deferred students, non-students, and spouses of students must pay an intramural activity fee for each semester in which they participate. Non-students must be active members of a BYU ward and their membership records must reside in the BYU ward that they attend.

The intramural activity fee is paid at the HHP College Services Office in 112 Richards Building. The cost is \$20.00 per semester during fall/winter and \$10.00 for spring/summer. A BYU ID or BYU Net ID with valid picture ID is required at time of payment. This fee will enable a participant to compete in any intramural activity during the appropriate semester.

CHECK IN:

All teams will need to report to the Sleepy Ridge Clubhouse twenty minutes before their scheduled tee time. Teams not at the clubhouse by this time will be forfeited from play and their entry fee will not be refunded. All participants must show valid picture ID for check-in. Part-time, deferred, and non-students must also present their paid receipt for the intramural activity fee.

TOURNAMENT INFORMATION:

1. Each team (2 players) will fill out an entry form in 145 RB.
2. Men's, women's, and coed teams will all play in the same division.
3. Each team will be paired with another team for each tee time.
4. USGA golf rules will govern tournament play.
5. A two-person scramble format will be used and the rules can be found in the *Golf Scramble Rules* section of this information sheet.
6. All rules of etiquette and fair play should be followed during the tournament.

EQUIPMENT:

All teams need to provide their own equipment or make rental arrangements on their own.

LIABILITY:

All participants play at their own risk and must acquire their own insurance.

Golf Scramble Rules

FORMAT: Nine-hole, two-person scramble tournament. (The front nine holes will be used.)

RULES: A scramble format means that both team members tee off on each hole and then decide which tee shot they like the best and mark the spot with a tee or ball marker. The other player picks up his/her ball and places it within one club length (no closer to the hole) of the marked spot. Both players hit their shot from the chosen spot. This procedure is followed on every shot for the remainder of the hole, including putts. The ball should be marked on the putting green also. Putts need to be made within 3 inches of the marked spot (no closer to the hole). The first ball to go in the hole is counted for the team score. If the ball you choose to play is in a hazard (sand, water, etc.), or in the rough, you cannot drop the ball outside of the hazard or rough even if relief is within one club length away. **Men start from the white tees. If a birdie is made on the preceding hole, then the team must move back to the blue tees. Likewise, if a bogey or lower is made then the team will either move up to or stay at the white tees depending on their location at the last tee box. Women will always tee off from the red tees. Each team member must use at least three tee shots during the nine holes.** Make a note on the scorecard to indicate whose tee shot was used on each hole.

AWARDS: There will be overall team awards given to the top three teams. Individual awards will also be given for closest to the pin, longest putt made, and longest drive.

INDIVIDUAL COMPETITIONS:

Hole #4: Closest to the Pin: If you choose to participate, you must tee off from the blue tees (Women can participate from the red tees). This competition has **one** division. If your tee shot is closest to the hole, write your name on the marker card and place the marker in the ground on the spot where your ball came to rest. Once the marker has been placed in the ground, it should stay there until someone else hits a closer shot. Use the flag stick as a measuring rod if it is a close call. Then, that person should repeat the procedure of writing their name on the card below the other name(s) and place the marker at the spot.

Hole #2: Longest Putt Made: This competition has **one** division. If your putt is the longest made, write your name on the marker card and place the marker in the ground on the spot from where you putted the ball. Once the marker has been placed in the ground, it should stay there until someone else makes a longer putt. Use the flag as a measuring rod if it is a close call. Then, that person should repeat the procedure of writing their name on the card below the other name(s) and place the marker at the spot.

Hole #5: Longest Drive: If you choose to participate, you must tee off from the blue tees (Women can participate from the red tees). If your drive is the longest, write your name on the

marker card and place the marker in the ground on the spot where your ball came to rest. The ball must be in the cut fairway to count. Once the marker has been placed in the ground, it should stay there until someone else hits a longer drive. Then, that person should repeat the procedure of writing their name on the card below the other name(s) and place the marker at the spot.

AWARDS PRESENTATION: Awards for the golf tournament can be picked up beginning May 23 in the Intramural Office, located in 145 RB.
